Foundations 5d—Abounding in Faith with Thanksgiving

“Therefore, leaving the discussion of the elementary principles of Christ, let us go on to perfection, not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, of the doctrine of baptisms, of laying on of hands, of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment. And this we will do if God permits”. **Hebrews 6:1-3**

The Lord Jesus said “Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them.” **Mark 11:24**

The Lord said “when you pray believe you receive”. He did not say “Pray, and later if you see any signs that make you think your prayer is being answered, then believe”. No, He did not say that! We are to pray with faith. “When you pray believe you receive”. That means we do the believing WHEN we pray. If we truly believe that we receive, then we should give thanks to the Lord for receiving what we just asked Him for.

“Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of Him.” **1John 5:14-15**

When we pray according to God’s Word, we know we are praying according to His will. We know He hears us and that we receive what we asked.

“Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; 7 and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.” **Philippians 4:6-7**

Paul instructs us to let our prayers be made “with thanksgiving”. If we do this, our faith will be strong, even to overflowing.

Paul taught the Colossian saints to overflow in strong faith by giving thanks.

“As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, as you have been taught, abounding in it (faith) with thanksgiving.” **Colossians 2:6-7**

Praying and confessing God’s Word, with thanksgiving, causes our faith to overflow. Praying and speaking God’s Word activates the promises of God to be fulfilled. Following are some promises we can activate by thanking God for them as our faith overflows. Let’s practice giving thanks daily.

Thank You Lord that I am saved!

“For whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.” **Romans 10:13**

Thank You that your mercies are new every morning.

“Through the Lord’s mercies we are not consumed. Because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness.” **Lamentations 3:22-23**

Thank You that your precious blood has washed away all my sins.

“In Whom (Jesus) we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins” **Colossians 1:14**

“Come now, and let us reason together,” says the Lord, “Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall be as wool.” **Isaiah 1:18**

Thank You that You do not remember my sins.

“Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more” **Hebrews 10:17**

Thank You that I a NEW CREATION in Christ Jesus.

“Therefore, if anyone *is* in Christ, *he is* a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.” **2 Corinthians 5:17**

Thank You Lord that I have been delivered from the power of darkness and You have brought me into the kingdom of Your beloved Son, Jesus.

“Giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed *us* into the kingdom of the Son of His love” **Colossians 1:12-13**

Thank You that, in Christ, I receive an abundance of grace and the gift of righteousness.

“For if by the one man’s offense death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ.” **Romans 5:17**

Thank You, Lord Jesus, that now You are my righteousness (I am now right with God), You are my sanctification (transformation into Christlikeness) and my redemption (deliverance and wholeness). I give You all the glory for saving me, changing me and keeping me.

“But of Him (God) you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God — and righteousness and sanctification and redemption— that, as it is written, “He who glories, let him glory in the Lord.” **1 Corinthians 1:30-31**
